Flag Etiquette

The state requires schools to adopt a policy around teaching the pledge of allegiance. This is Bluffview's current policy:

This is based on this state statute: https://www.revisor.mn.gov/statutes/cite/121A.11

The board has waived the requirement to recite the pledge of allegiance once a week at Bluffview.

It currently states:

"Students will be instructed in the proper etiquette toward and respect for the flag. The flag will be displayed, the text of the Pledge will be made available to students, and individual students will be allowed to recite the Pledge during the day if they choose to do so. Teachers and school staff will provide support and guidance to individual students as necessary and as appropriate."

The board would like more information about what each level does (if anything) around teaching the pledge/flag etiquette before they finalize the policy in October.

- CH has a flag on the wall; do the flags of the world; not etiquette; more at the level of recognizing which flag it is; if students ask they will go into it; don't have it printed because they are unable to read the actual words; respect for all materials can cross over into respect for the flags
- E1 does not teach flag etiquette; important things are to respect the flag, not a toy, what it is a symbol of; found there are many pieces to flag etiquette; they each have a laminated copy of the pledge
- E2 have a mounted flag; don't have pledge posted anywhere; when they talk about the Revolution, students can explore the symbolism of the flag as an extension; when talking about how other cultures show respect, they can discuss the symbolism of our flag
- ErdK when teaching the Revolutionary war and western expansion
- Questions Does the citizenship test for the United States say anything about the Flag?

The board would like to see some type of "flag etiquette" taught at each level as part of Montessori "grace and courtesy".
