## New Statewide System to Support Student Learning

COMPASS, Collaborative Minnesota Partnerships to Advance Student Success, is a new statewide education system to support student learning recovery. COMPASS is aimed at accelerating student learning by meeting their academic, social-emotional and mental health needs as we continue to navigate the COVID-19 pandemic. Educators, school staff and school leaders will have new opportunities for professional learning and coaching, along with coordinated support from experts at the Minnesota Department of Education (MDE), Minnesota Service Cooperatives and Regional Centers of Excellence.



COMPASS aligns with Governor Tim Walz's <u>Due North Education Plan</u> to work together with educators to provide teaching and learning supports, to create better results and experiences for all students. The strategies focus on: closing gaps; ending disparities in access, participation, and representation; serving students of color and Indigenous students, students receiving special education services, and English learners; increasing graduation rates for every student group; and, having more students report that they feel safe and welcome in school.
