			We're looking at the number of students scoring in the 40th percentile or higher  Students in grades that are 40th percentile or higher:	

79% of K in early math 71% of K in early reading

55% of 1st in early math 27% of 1st in early reading

66% of 2nd in aMath 69% of 2nd in aReading

67% of 3rd in aMath 71% of 3rd in aReading

72% of 4th in aMath 77% of 4th in aReading

72% of 5th in aMath 63% of 5th in aReading

76% of 6th in aMath 88% of 6th in aReading

90% of 7th in aMath 95% of 7th in aReading

82% of 8th in aMath 88% of 8th in aReading

Drastic drop between K and 1st in early reading. 1st grade does word segmenting, nonsense words, sight words, and sentence reading at the start of the year. At the end of year, K test has letter sounds, word segmenting, nonsense words, and sight words.

In 2024/25, the K (current 1st years) that group started at 91% proficient, and dropped to 27% proficient at the end of the year, when more skills were added.

5th drops down in reading before jumping back up in 6th.

The 6th grade group (which we've been in general cautious for) are catching up and gaining lost ground.

7th and 8th are doing really well.

Might be beneficial for 1st years to take both earlyReading and aReading and the math counterparts in spring, to prepare them for the new test type.

Fifth grade's start-of-year scores dropped over the last four years (78%, 80%, 92%, to the current 63%). mportant to note, both 2nd and 5th are the middle years.
