Potential SEL grant

We met about the grant, and several left with some research to do. We are weighing the pros and cons of the program. It is a great concept, but we believe that between HVMH and Kelly Skilicorn, all of the concepts can be reviewed and covered plus more.

Upon reviewing the scope and sequence that we have received, Kelly S suggested that she can tweak a few little things, and cover the items that are listed in the grant. With that covered, HVMH can focus on their positive mental health approach and resilience building. Between being able to cover all their concepts and quite a few more beyond that, coupled with the requirements of the grant and the simple fact that we have strong resources here whereas many other schools may not, I am leaning toward withdrawing from the grant application process entirely, allowing another school with fewer resources to benefit from the grant.

Am still waiting for a PELSB response to how I am supposed to report the periods/minutes to complete the paperwork Stacy requested.

Senator Miller

Jeremy Miller did visit the school on October 3rd. He had never visited the site. We discussed a few topics including Charter funding disparities like the Small School Revenue which he was knowledgeable about, new DHS regulations for the pre-k and the dysfunctionality of DHS and MDE with regard to working together, our Authorizer situation, and other MACs initiatives.

We have followed that meeting up with an open invitation to Representative Gene Pelowski. He responded yesterday via email, and indicated that he will schedule a visit with us as he is able.

WSU practicum students

Linda has jumped in as the liaison to Marriane Texley and making arrangements with the Special Ed teachers in training from WSU-they will have 12 students here twice a week, practicing their craft with some of our students.

Foster Transportation Agreement

MDE chose to grant us access to our Title I money, even though we still don't have the agreement to submit. They offered a temporary, alternate path until the agreement is made available. Docs I submitted to MDE showed that I began requesting it in September of 2018.

Cultural competencies with Jonathan Locust

During this process, I discovered that the state is now looking for 6-8 hours of this training to fulfill relicensure requirements...and have ever so graciously offered a list of groups that can fulfill the requirements, all of which charge the small school friendly fee of about \$5000.

Jonathan agreed to do another session this winter (Jan 17th) for 3 hours, getting the total trainings up to 6.5 total hours. I will be pressing PELSB hard to accept this, as they stated that they don't like a series of trainings in this case.
