COMMITTEE NORMS:

Group agreed to new committee norms

OPEN HOUSE:

Group agreed to revamp our approach to open house

- Need better and earlier communication about event (more about open house, less about food donations)
- Would like to combine it with Back-to-school BBQ
 - o Rebrand it from Breads and Spreads to just be an open house in connection with BBQ
- If a standalone event, it would be best split up as:
 - First half, students guide parents at open house / last half, food and community

HAPPY HARVEST:

Group agreed that we need to focus on making this event more meaningful for students ACTION: Talk with Sherry about what needs to go out to families (DREW)

- Sherry will get what we need to send out organized and we will get something out to families by end of this week (done through Signup Genius)
- Teachers need to update the spreadsheet to include their projects and supplies needed

RP EVENTS ACTION TEAM (breakout):

Group agreed to focus on hosting two events throughout the school year

- One January and one April
- Themes will be Technology Use and Wellness (respectively)
- We need to get volunteers for child care
- We need to arrange Erdkinder students becoming facilitators for events
- We need staff to step in to help train students
- We also need to develop resources to go home with families at the end of events (continuing education)

NEW FAMILY WELCOME ACTION TEAM (breakout):

ACTION: Ask Henry/Sherry what already goes out to families when they enroll (MARIAH/DREW)

- Send a postcard to new students when they enroll as a personal message welcoming them
 - Have a picture of the school on it (something to connect them to BMS)
- Send a letter/personal note to new parents when they enroll to:
 - Welcome them
 - Encourage active participation in their student's school experience
 - Remind we're always accepting volunteers and how to become one
 - Explain yearly school events and what to expect
- Group has discussed in the past also giving out some "promo items" as a gift to new students/families
