Summer program

Ellie Therapy and FCC are contracted and providing much needed services for our students. These additional services are to be paid for with ESSER monies. We are also working out other applications like sending Erdkinder to the Centerville Curling Club for a fun outing. Sherry has submitted a lease request to the YMCA for a "Bluffview Day" at their Camp Wenonah on May 1. Lexia was purchased for our floating sub to engage our struggling grade 2 students in an afterschool group 2 days a week as well. We have a <u>spreadsheet</u> of ideas that we are considering. We are really focused on 2 pathways-direct student supports like this reading group, and the Carry On group as that is what the spirit of the ESSER funds are for, and the second is to ensure that we are upgrading our tech and other resources with this one time

money as much as possible as we have to be mindful of our bond covenant requirements which does require some purchasing of capital equipment to maintain a proper ratio. We are also looking at PE ideas for afterschool clubs (like la crosse, snowshoeing) where we can purchase equipment that will carry over into PE for the long term.

Esser II money has been earmarked for a second Covid mitigation practices stipend for all staff this spring.

Non-binary bathroom

Work with OWA. Good location agreed on, working on plans/details. Interesting fact-different bathroom fixture codes from the building's year of construction to now-then we were compliant with the number of fixtures. By today's code, we are one short so this will check more than one box.

BKDV-Arbitrage Group

As part of our Bond agreements with UMB and the Winona Port Authority, we are required to have an <u>arbitrage</u> calculation done after the 5th complete year of our bonds being refinanced. That said, it is one year overdue, but is not in process. Essentially, it is a box to check to ensure that no fiscal wrong doing is taking place as it pertains to interest rate (positive or negative arbitrage at 4.5982%).
