 - (E1) Writing more a challenge than reading (thinking of ideas on their own, critical thinking after doing a reading)
 - Spelling (already at their own pace but the skills learned aren't being reflected in their writing, sentence structure)
 - o (Erd) Spelling, capitalization rules
 - (CH) Blending (effort but also the skill to copy it or write it), has to refer to the cursive letters as shapes
 - (E2) Writing (don't have the problem solving skills), attention to details (missing elements when copying), and punct, handwriting is worse than we've seen in the past, spelling
 - (Int) Vocabulary
 - (Int) Spelling and vocabulary

- 1 year program
- Would have to have live sessions scheduled so all could attend
- o Can they start it in the summer? What about those
 - Option 1 cohort with random people but more on your schedule
 - Option 2 cohort with all in building
- o Prevents you from going ahead, all talking about the same topics
- o MN based; MTSS embedded which is nice
 - Tiered assessments
- Liked the last one, but this one like the time factor
- Can take it further with optional aspects
- No books, all on Canvas; some may be printing parts of it then; can't print off Canvas, can go back and forth; may have an option to print the webscreen as snapshot
- o Bluffview cohort need a minimum of 40
 - Would only reach these numbers if paras and assistants are included
 - Would it be empowering to the assistants?
 - Not worth their time to go through all of it
- Like this one better because of time and more accessibility; in the long run better to have it condensed into one year; optional extensions
- Prefers this one because it is all online; as long as you always have access to it;
 Henry did something 3 years ago that is still on his Canvas platform
- What happens, when not in a cohort, someone doesn't participate? No repercussions yet; wondering what statewide says - you deal with it
- How long you'll have online access for is still being determined; no books included in this format

CORE

- Many HVED schools are going with this one because it's the shortest
- Access to the online materials for only the 1 year it takes to complete the program; keep the books as reference
- Like the classroom simulation experiences
- o Asynchronous but still chunk it so it keeps everyone at the same pace
- Forum for all to chat
- Feels like focused on struggling readers whereas the others seem they focus on general reading education; additional tools for supporting struggling readers
- Shortest time commitment
- Will we get everything out of it that we want if it's so short
- Has a math program

Want the one that's the most useful to us

- Paper resources
- Doesn't take two years; if we have already learned how to teach, do we need to get that indepth
- Has continuing support options
