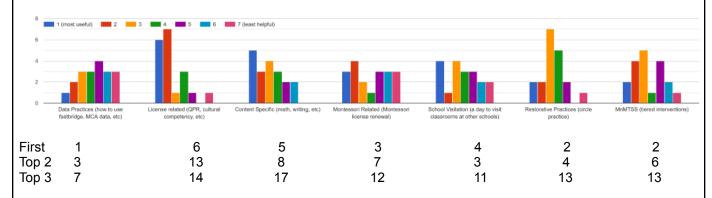
Professional Development Options
