I think in general the school does a good job with most things and the communication concerns our family had last year are significantly less of a problem this year so I am pleased about that.

Bluffview does a great job at creating a sense of community for everyone. I also feel like my kids now in their second year at Bluffview coming from traditional school have settled in nicely to what is expected of them but yet still able to be themselves. and I talk about some of the amazing educational experiences and opportunities that are getting to have within the classroom and afterschool and how grateful we are for that. I do be ieve that those experiences and opportunities are unique to Bluffview.

Oh and the lunches! :) We appreciate the thought and care that goes into nutritious food for the kids!

I think Bluffview is very welcoming to children and families with a broad variety of backgrounds. I also think Bluffview does a great job of meeting individual students particular needs.



This year, my daughter has fallen behind in certain areas and I am not notified of this, until she tells me or until conferences, which are only twice a year. I feel as if a student is strugg ing, the parent should be made aware right away. For example, my daughter failed three spelling tests in a row, and only when she told me about it was I made aware.

I have a kid just above the curve for reading so he can't get help from certain programs. It would be nice if there was a program that helped them even more when they're strugg ing with reading

Teachers could communicate more with parents-more email updates throughout the year.

Better communication from teachers, maybe a simple website/portal with what they learning through photos?

I'd love to have a better pulse on what is being expected of my children on a daily basis, and how they're progressing in their learning. 2x/yr at conferences is nice but doesn't feel ample for us to be engaged on the home front. Perhaps a monthly email or call just to stay connected? Not sure that's feasible, but something along those lines would be great!

I do worry sometimes about safety and security, though I think I would at any school in this time. I am not sure there is really anything extra that can be done, but if there were any opportunities to make improvements for safety/security that were made available, I would definitely support that as a parent. We did have 1 ask from the teacher about parents pitching in to purchase a school material. (some specific reading books, Bobs Books) I actually wish that these asks happened more as we are always looking for ways to support the school, and purchasing specific items is definitely something we can help with throughout the year. I liked that it was completely optional and anonymous.

I understand the Montessori teaching style, but I do wish that there were lessons to watch/see in person sometimes. It just matches my child's learning style better than trying to ask his peers who don't always want to or can help him learn more.

Space seems to be an issue - crowding in hallways, entryways, and classrooms. I don't know how this could be easily solved however.

Teach children that words can hurt, and children look different. Stop the boys will be boys mind set. Encourage more stem (especially women and people of color in stem)

Increase the communication between parents when students are envoyled in picking on others/bullying. There needs to be another step past talking with the students and making student plans.

Slowly increase homework sent home with E2 students to prepare them for Erdkinder.

The transition from E1 to E2 is a shocker for these kids. I have seen typical kids struggle with it, when you have a neurodivergent kiddo the stress is magnified. The fall and early winter for my daughter was so hard (that feels ike an understatement). The staff were all new to her and her to them. Suddenly, dailies can become homework, recess is shorter, expectations are higher and more demanding, and celebrations of any kind are gone. They enter E2 at only about 9 years old. Still just elementary age kids. A transition of some kind at the end of the 3rd year in E1 would be helpful. I also think something to look forward to like birthdays or classroom celebration of some kind would help keep some of the fun of grade school there.

Communication should be improved overall. I shouldn't have to ask for updates on lunch balance and I should have a general idea of what my kids are learning.

When students make errors on their assignments, they should be shown how to get the proper answer instead of simply marking it wrong.

Send assignements home to be completed so they can be turned in on time and not get behind



The only suggestion I have is that the behavior reports (CH) could be more detailed and allow for 2 way communication. When working through behaviors it is necessary to have as much information as possible. It is possible to give more information without hindering instruction time. Home vs school is very different in most cases so families often won't see the concerning behaviors and home and vise versa.

More information about what my child is working on and how to support it at home. For example: pink shelf, blue shelf, green shelf doesn't mean anything to parents. Even during conferences taking the time to pull materials off the shelf to show how they work and what the child is doing would be helpful. It's hard to have conversations at home about school when you don't know the skill that goes with the name of the work.

I wish there was a little more consistency from classroom to classroom especially for families with more children. Specifically in regards to what is acceptable in a Montessori classroom in terms of works. The main example that comes to mind is that Mr. Josh has an art table available in his classroom for students in the mornings, while in Ms. Anna's class coloring can only be done as a part of a specific work. Since we don't offer art until 1st grade, having more space for self expression (even if limited) would be great.

Easily allow for Zoom parent-teacher conferences, keep up communication with parents, pay teachers higher wages (number one priority) - could a different partnership be set up with the District so that bluffview is "part" of the district versus a separate charter school?

Im extremely concerned about school bus anecdotes from my child and other parents, both my children will be riding the bus next year and I'm genuinely fearful of the experience. I'd like to see school bus supervision in the future.

Not at this time

Focus on challenging kids who are above the average mark

I love the way that Montessori allows students to work at their own pace and go as far as they can with a task/work. To that end, I would like to see strong students be challenged more consistently and in more areas—how can that be built into lessons and individual work time more clearly?
