


















































































































Regarding Covid, what would you identify as having gone poorly or should have been implemented more effectively?

The early days of teleschool were a nightmareish hellscape of fear and despair. I don't think the school could have done anything to change that.




There were far too many restrictions, and these restrictions interfered with learning, teaching, and social and emotional development and they had an adverse effect on our children's mental health.
