Under a management agreement between the two organizations, the City is responsible for maintaining and operating the facility and WAYHA is responsible for programming. This public/private partnership has produced a new indoor ice refrigeration system and outdoor ice rink that overlooks the beautiful Mississippi River.

# PARKS & TRAILS

Winona's park system contains 27 parks, 3,000 acres of park land, & numerous paved and unpaved trails.

#### **Bluffside Park**

Bluffside Park contains 10 miles of multi-use trails, which provide picturesque views of the Mississippi River valley from atop the bluffs. Trails may be used for mountain biking, hiking, skiing, and snowshoeing and vary in difficulty. New trail coming soon!

#### Sugar Loaf Park

Sugar Loaf is a regional destination for beginner and intermediate hiking and sport climbing. Come back in the winter for ice climbing, one of only a few human made ice climbing parks in the nation.

#### Aghaming Park

Located across from the main channel from downtown Winona, Aghaming Park is an unique natural refuge close to home. Aghaming Park contains 1,950 acres of some of the most well preserved floodplain forest in the country, providing habitat for unique birds and wildlife. Cooperatively managed by the US Fish & Wildlife, more information can be found at www.fws.gov.

#### Flyway Trail

Bridging the bluffs of Minnesota and Wisconsin is the Flyway Connector Trail. Approximately 8 miles of out & back multi-use trail connects Buffalo County with Winona via Aghaming Park and Latsch Island.

#### **Garvin Heights Park**

Garvin Heights Park offers an expansive blufftop view, with Lake Pepin and Trempealeau Mountain visible in clear conditions. Explore restored goat prairie and oak savannah ecosystems native to the Driftless Region on hiking paths through the park. Trailhead is located at the base of the bluff, near the intersection of Garvin Heights Road and West Lake Bloulevard The trail length is 0.4 miles and includes 378 man-made steps on the upper part of the trail.

#### **Prairie Island Park**

Located on the banks of the Mississippi, Prairie Island has a 1.5 mile trail winding through the riverbed forest ideal for hiking. The park also contains public boat landings, dog park, wildlife viewing, fishing, playground, volleyball and horseshoe pits, and camping adjacent at Prairie Island Campground.

#### **Mountain Bike Park**

Thanks to a generous donation by the Shirley and Will Oberton family, an exhilarating new play space is on the horizon for mountain bike enthusiasts in Bluffside Park as plans for a bicycle skills playground are realized. The park will be located within the western stretch of the High and Low Rollers between Holzinger Lodge and Stone Circle and have three distinct ride hubs of varying ability that will offer a circuit course brimming with rollers, banked turns, jumps, and drops. The anticipated construction date is July 2024.

#### Sinclair Basketball Court

Sinclair Park, aka "Dinosaur Park," just got a prehistoric makeover. This summer, thanks to ATE Recreation, we have a newly refinished basketball court! Challenge the resident purple dinosaur to a friendly game of P-T-E-R-O-D-A-C-T-Y-L and take your best Jurassic jump shot!

#### Windom Park Gazebo

Visit Windom Park to see the newly installed cedar shake roof on the gazebo, it is beautiful! Here's some park trivia for you. William Windom, for whom the park was named, lived across the street in the 1870s, served in the U.S. Congress and Senate for a total of 24 years, and was twice Secretary of the Treasury.

#### Sidewalk Project at ERC

Part of the sidewalk in front of the East Recreation will be under construction this fall! The project will include adding a curb cut and sloped entrance to the main facility doors. Throughout the project, the ERC will remain open for drop-in hours and scheduled programming.

#### Madison Park Playground

Attention all parents, kids, and playtime enthusiasts! We're thrilled to announce that a brand new playground is coming to the former Madison Elementary School site including a 2-5 and a 5-12 year old play set along with a swing set and basketball hoops. Stay tuned for updates on the design, construction process, and the grand opening date.

#### The Willows Disc Golf Course

We are embarking on a significant renovation project to enhance the disc golfing experience at "The Willows," Winona's East Lake Course. The transformation will include an 18-hole course with a thoughtfully redesigned layout, new baskets, and concrete t-pads. We've already begun the renovation process but still have a ways to go so please consider making a donation to the Winona Community Foundation to make the course even better!

#### **Bluff Traverse Conservation and Recreation Area**

Phase 1 & 2 construction projects have commenced in Bluffside and Sugar Loaf Parks. Projects include the addition of four new trails, totaling 5.4 miles, and trailhead improvements. Of the four trails, there will be two "green" multi-use trails and two "blue" intermediate mountain bike-only trails.




#### Lake Lodge Recreation Center-113 Lake Park Drive West


