Even though social and emotional learning is provided once a week, how can the relationship of the school counselor to students be made more positively? I don't hear much positive feedback, and if there was some more, maybe the students would take social learning more seriously, because our students need this learning, especially since covid.

Not that you're not trying, but improving faculty and staff pay and benefits would go a long way to ensuring quality and preventing turnover.

In light of what the country's been going through in the past few years, I think educators in general ought to be thinking more about educating for practical citizenship...what does it mean to be a citizen; what does it mean to be a democracy; what are the basics of American government institutions; what does it mean to be a good citizen.
