33. Please provide a brief summary of what went well in this year's implementation of evidence-based literacy instruction.

A lot of productive work and conversation around our plans and processes. As we continue to move into MNMTSS (we are just finishing up the initial 6 sessions, will register for the +9 when able). Montessori has always been considered evidence based, so the ongoing implementation tends to develop strong readers and thinkers. Our refinement of the Tier 2 & 3 processes as we develop our MNMTSS handbook over the coming year will be a great piece to ensure alignment of all plans.

34. Briefly describe what needs to be refined in the district or charter school's implementation of evidencebased literacy instruction.

We need to develop a more targeted Montessori scope and sequence for grades 1-6. This would include teaching all the materials in the standards, but in our own way.

35. Provide a brief description of next steps the district or charter school will take to improve implementation of evidence-based literacy instruction.

Next year the schools focus is on completing the Read Act professional development-we chose CORE because it is "asset based", and as a Montessori school, we have a great deal of assets already in place. The year after that, we will be completing a full ELA Montessori / state standards alignment project.
