Student Data Privacy Act

On May 22nd 2022, Governor Walz signed the Student Data Privacy Act into law, which will go into effect for the 2022-23 school year.

The new law adds some clarifying definitions:

- A "**school-issued device**" is hardware OR software that a public school (or a technology provider) provides to a student for personal use.
- A "technology provider" is anyone who contracts with a public school to issue a device for student use *and* gets access to educational data as a part of the contract.

<u>Law Requirements:</u>

- Schools <u>Must Inform</u> Parents and Students of any programs or contracts with technology providers that deal with student data, <u>30 days before school starts</u> via US mail, email, or direct communication.
 - Notice must include information on the provider, the student data affected, the contract, and contact information for questions or concerns.
 - Interested families must be given opportunity to inspect the contracts ahead of time.
- New Rules for Technology Providers:
 - Student data cannot be owned by technology providers.
 - Security breaches of educational data must be <u>disclosed</u> to the school.
 - Student data must be destroyed before a contract ends.
 - o **Selling / sharing student data** is <u>not</u> allowed.
 - Commercial use of student data is not allowed.
 - School contracts must ensure data security / limit data access.
- New Rules on Student Privacy: Government Entities and Service Providers <u>cannot</u> access or monitor student data, audio/video transmissions or recordings, or student interactions.
 - Exceptions include legal warrants, finding devices, life-threatening safety situations, compliance with federal or state laws, pre-agreed contractual purposes with specific staff, or for approved federal or state program purposes like E-Rate.
 - Notification to students / families is required within 72 hours if Student Data is accessed or monitored, or 72 hours after "an imminent threat" is over.
